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

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

Indigenous Community Input

- Comments from and meetings with nine tribes/groups

Collaborative Management Influences

- ONMS experience (e.g., in Olympic Coast, Hawaii, American Samoa)

Other Key Issues

- Equal protection principles

- National Marine Sanctuaries Act (NMSA) and the role of Sanctuary Advisory Councils and their working groups
- Department of Commerce Joint Project Authority (15 U.S.C. 1525)








NOAA's Management Authority and Operational Responsibilities

Examples:

- Hiring of federal staff and associated personnel management.
- Enforcement of sanctuary regulations.
- Management of the sanctuary's Congressionallyappropriated budget.
- Procurements made with federal funds.
- Maintenance and operation of federally owned or funded facilities, vessels, IT functions, security requirements.
- Establishment (under NMSA) of a Sanctuary Advisory Council.







Intergovernmental Policy Council (IPC)

- Concept proposed by SYBCI.
- Modeled on Olympic Coast IPC.
- Purpose: A forum for communication, information exchange, and governmental policy coordination/recommendations regarding sanctuary management.
- Potential Members: Federally-recognized Tribe(s), State of California (likely Natural Resources Agency); and NOAA (possibly voting or non-voting participant).
- Could <u>focus on bigger picture</u> cultural issues, opportunities, and sanctuary-related projects or actions.
- IPC ideas could be taken up by others (SAC, ICAP or Foundation).
- Low administrative burden may meet several times per year.



Intergovernmental Policy Council (IPC)


Federally recognized tribe(s), State of CA, and possibly NOAA





Sanctuary Advisory Council

- Provides one of several opportunities for those with indigenous community knowledge to become involved with the sanctuary.
- 15 seats allowed (an NMSA limit).
- Seat for Federally-recognized Tribe.
- One or more Indigenous Community seats, open to individuals with relevant cultural knowledge.
- Could organize seats geographically (e.g., northern vs. southern sanctuary territory).







Indigenous Cultures Advisory Panel (ICAP)

- A working group of the SAC.
- Provides advice and guidance to the SAC on indigenous cultural issues and opportunities.
- Open to individuals with indigenous cultural knowledge linked to the sanctuary area.
- Advice to the SAC can also be shared with the IPC and foundation partner.
- Communication and coordination required between groups.


- ICAP could help with:
 - Development of sanctuary programs promoting indigenous culture; design of outreach materials containing cultural references or artwork; messaging for educational programs; establishment of inter-tribal protocols related to cultural activities in different areas of the sanctuary.





Non-Profit Foundation(s)

- Use of Joint Project Authority (JPA)
 Agreements to enable ONMS and partnering non-profit foundations to invest in joint projects that support the mission of the sanctuary.
- Similar to ONMS existing JPA arrangements with Greater Farallones Association and California Marine Sanctuary Foundation.
- Enhances sanctuary's capacity; provides another entity to help fund Indigenous Community initiatives.
- Concept of SYBCI and others.









Government-to-Government Consultation

- Executive Order (E.O.) 13175, "Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribal Governments"
- Department of Commerce Administrative Order (DAO) 2188 and "Tribal Consultation and Coordination Policy of the U.S. Department of Commerce"

Non-Profit Foundation(s)

Partner using Joint Project Authority. Includes Foundation Director, Board, Staff, sub-groups

Coordination

Intergovernmental Policy Council (IPC)

15 members, including a federally recognized tribal seat, and one or more indigenous culture seats.

Coordination, Communication

Indigenous Cultures Advisory Panel (ICAP)

A Working Group of the SAC. Open to individuals wit indigenous cultural knowledge of the sanctuary sea

Coordination

Federally recognized tribe(s), State of CA, and possibly NOA.


